

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Grading System

| Grading Scale Full grades * | Grading Scale Partial grades * | Wording (English) | Performance |
|--|---|------------------------------|---|
| 1,0 | 1,0 / 1,3 | Very Good | Excellent Performance |
| 2,0 | 1,7 / 2,0 / 2,3 | Good | Performance considerably exceeding the average standard |
| 3,0 | 2,7 / 3,0 / 3,3 | Satisfactory | Performance meeting the average standard |
| 4,0 | 3,7 / 4,0 | Sufficient / Pass | Performance meeting the minimum criteria |
| 5,0 | 5,0 | Insufficient / Fail | Performance not meeting the minimum criteria |

*Grading System:

Study results are expressed either in full grades (1,0 / 2,0 / 3,0 / 4,0 / 5,0) or in partial grades (1,0 / 1,3 / 1,7 etc.), depending on the course of study.

ECTS = ECTS-credit points

ECTS-credit points are a measure for the workload a student must complete in order to successfully pass the relevant study module. According to the German Rectors' Conference, one ECTS credit equals to approximately 30 hours workload. A normal workload for one term is 20, one semester 30 and for a full academic year 60 ECTS-credits.

Contact h. = Contact hours

This number indicates the contact hours per week for the relevant study module. One contact hour is 45 minutes long.

Semester:

Indicates in which semester the module has been passed. Letters WS stand for winter semester (1 October to 14 March) and SS for summer semester (15 March to 30 September), the digits refer to the academic year.

Degree studied:

Refers to the degree, a student would obtain if he or she graduated. Typically, exchange students are non-degree seeking, therefore in this context this indication merely provides information about the study plan valid for the student.
