Notes on the application process

Master's degree programme in Global Business Development

- 3-semester consecutive master's degree programme leading to an M.A.
- Accredited (FIBAA)
- Full-time study
- Two semesters studying on campus at Kempten University of Applied Sciences
- Third semester devoted to the master's thesis – as a rule based in a company

Requirements

- Business science-focused bachelor's degree worth 210 ECTS
- Final grade at least 2.5 ("good")
- At least 3 months spent in a foreign-language country, abroad
- English at least level B2
- German to at least level A1 within the first year of study

What needs including with your application?

- Curriculum vitae (bullet-point format)
- Copy of degree certificate your certificates will need to be validated by uni-assist. Register for the process well ahead of time at www.uni-assist.de and select the [VPD procedure](#). It takes about six weeks to validate certificates
- Evidence of any internships, professional experience, activities cited in CV
- Evidence of at least level B2 English (e.g. general university entrance certificate from a German grammar school)
- Evidence of time spent abroad
- Essay (2,000 characters) in English on a topic of your own choice relating to a subject area addressed on the master's degree programme
- If applicable: Evidence of level of German
