Use of electronic devices during examinations

The Examinations Committee passed the following resolution at its 180th meeting on 10 December 2025:

Electronic devices that can be used to cheat in an examination (e.g. mobile phones, smartphones, smart watches, smart glasses, or any other devices that can be used for exchanging data and/or communicating) may only be kept switched off and unworn, for example in bags underneath the tables. Any such devices that are switched on, unless explicitly permitted for the examination in question, are fundamentally considered a particularly serious violation of examination rules, as stipulated in § 10 (2) of the University Examination Regulations (“APO”) for Kempten of Applied Sciences. The examination is therefore deemed to have been failed. The Examinations Committee can ultimately withdraw the entitlement to take the bachelor’s or master’s examinations for the degree programme in question, or examinations for other professional development or additional qualification programmes, and thus impose exmatriculation.
